

Visitation and Outpatient Guidelines



Inpatient Visiting Hours –
7:00 am-8:30 pm,
exceptions apply for end
of life visits



All visitors, outpatients
and support persons are
required to be screened
and wear a mask and
additional PPE as necessary



Do not visit if ill.
Visitors must be 16 years
of age or older to visit
inpatients



All visitors should perform
hand hygiene before
entering the patient's room
All visits must occur in the
patient's room

No visitation is allowed for COVID-19 or suspected COVID-19 patients, or any patient in isolation.

Exceptions may be made for pediatrics, end of life, altered mental status, patients with physical/development needs, or as medically necessary.

Visitors must be trained on donning and doffing of appropriate PPE.

Behavioral Health Services

- Check with the unit directly for visitation hours and guidelines

Emergency Department

- One visitor per patient; visitors may switch out; pediatric patients can have two parents or guardians
- Additional visitors are determined on a case-by-case basis by the ED care team
- Visiting may be restricted at any time based on condition of the patient

End of Life

- No cap on number of visitors in a single day
- Unlimited duration of visit

Maternal Child

- One designated visitor may be admitted 24 hours per day
- Visiting may be restricted at any time based on the condition of the patient

Med/Surg & ICU Units

- Visitors should sign in at the nurse's station
- One support person allowed for a patient's one-hour admission process
- One visitor at a time for non-isolated patients; visitors may switch out
- Length of visit is unlimited during visiting hours

Outpatients

- Outpatients may have one support person accompany them to an appointment or procedure
- Please do not bring children under 16 to accompany you to your appointment or procedure

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
